

The value of photographic images is based not only on the time it takes to photograph a project, but also on how the images are used and by whom. Because multi-party usage, third party usage, and image licensing can be confusing we encourage all of our clients to download and read the article, "Working with an Architectural Photographer." (Available for download from the services section of www.barryhalkin.com).

Use of the images is licensed only to the party named in the estimate/invoice. If the cost of the shoot is being shared by any third party, the photographer must be informed prior to the shoot to arrange for appropriate licensing. Involving additional parties will save costs for all involved. We can provide clients with proposals/estimates to explain how.

Standard licensing includes the following:

- Use in portfolios, archival databases, office displays, firm monographs presentation, lectures and trade shows.
- Submittal to design competitions.
- Submittal to editors/publishers for review (Specific permission to be arranged and fees paid by publishers for all other editorial uses).
- Images may be scanned, stored, and printed in digital form for output in short run project sheets and short run folios
- Use on web site maintained by the invoiced party under their URL and social media websites.
- Use in brochure or mailing piece promoting the invoiced company

Commercial licensing includes the following:

- Standard licensing rights (listed above)
- Advertising in perpetuity

All other rights are reserved by the photographer. Photographers credit line (© 20XX Halkin Mason Photography LLC) is to appear on all reproduced and distributed images. Use of the images by any other party other than the invoiced party must be licensed by Halkin Mason Photography LLC. Unlicensed use by a third party is a copyright violation.
